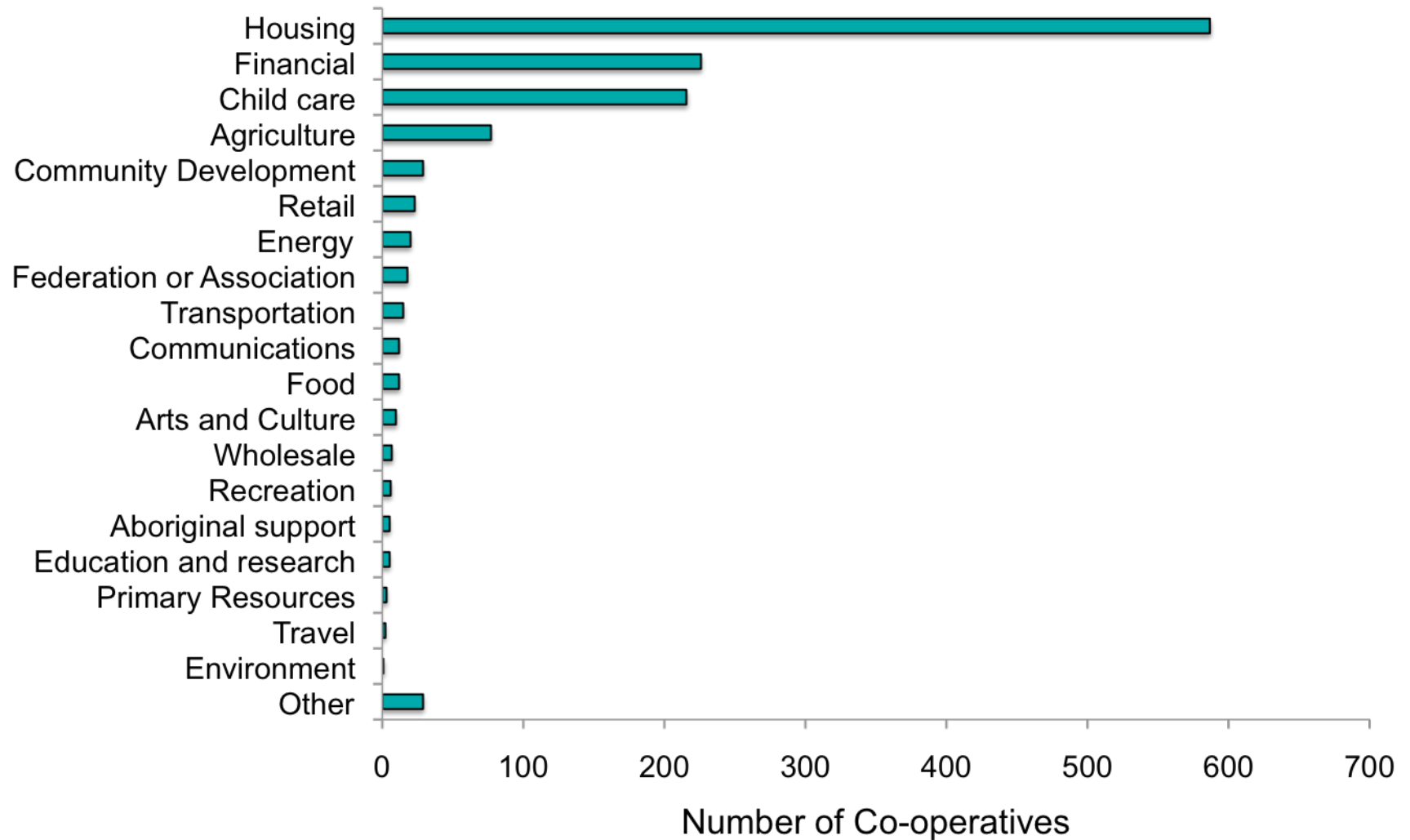
Introduction

- ❑ Builds upon the 2003 National Survey of Nonprofit and Voluntary Organizations (NSNVO)
 - NSNVO surveyed 2,250 Ontario nonprofit and voluntary organizations
 - Surveyed nonprofits that were formally incorporated or registered with provincial or federal governments
 - However, most co-operatives were not included
- ❑ Survey of co-operatives conducted in Summer 2007 by Ontario Co-operative Association
 - Attempted contact with all Ontario co-operatives
 - Questionnaire based on NSNVO

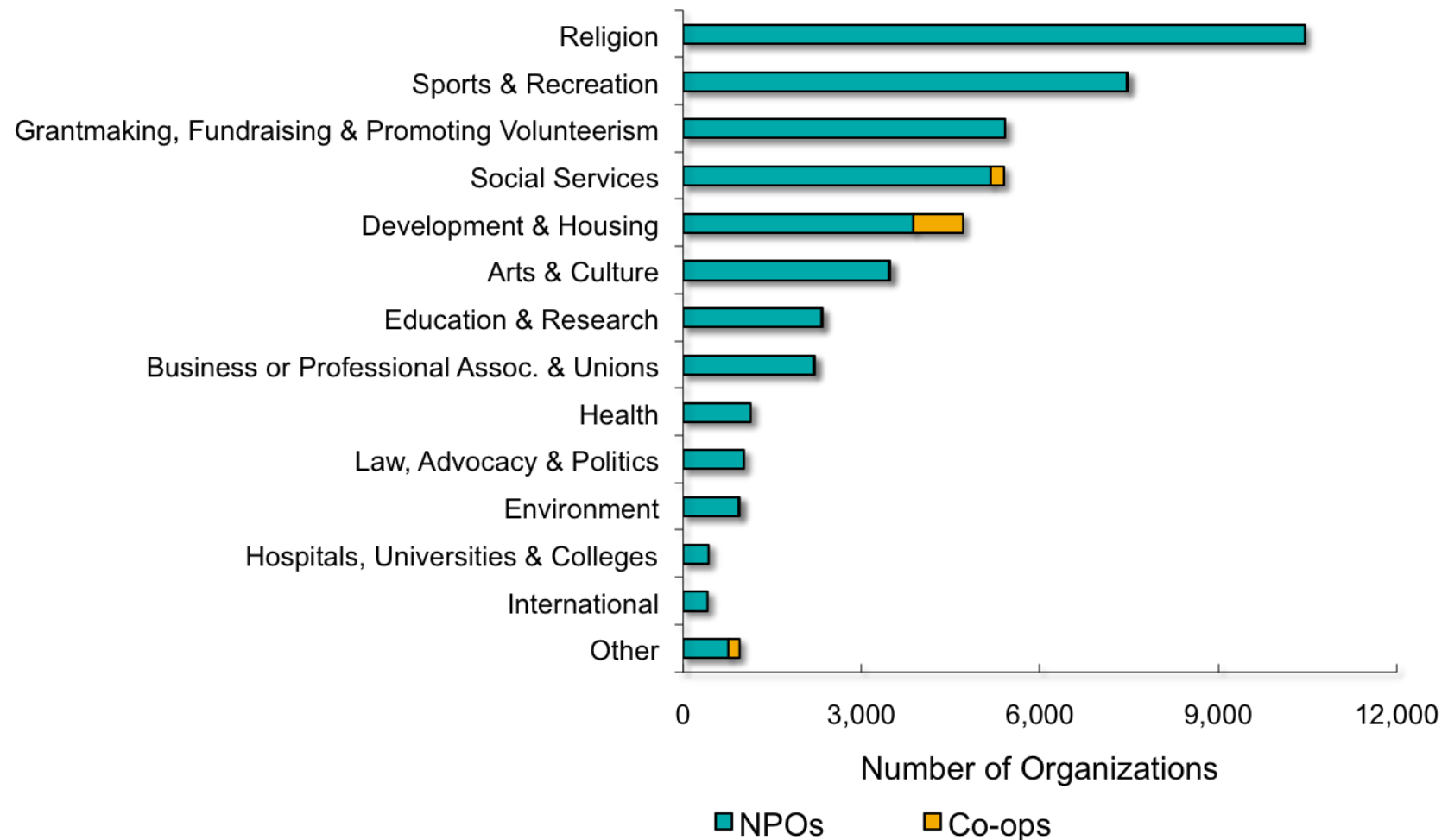
Major Findings

- ❑ Co-operatives relatively small in number
 - Approximately 1,300 co-operatives in Ontario vs. 45,000 nonprofits - about 3% of total number of organizations
- ❑ Significant contribution to revenues
 - \$4.6 billion vs. \$51.8 for nonprofits - about 8% of total revenues for social economy
- ❑ Relatively small paid staff contribution
 - 15,000 vs. 959,000 for nonprofits - about 2% of social economy employment
- ❑ Small number of volunteers
 - Volunteer complement of 49,000 vs. 7.8 million for nonprofits

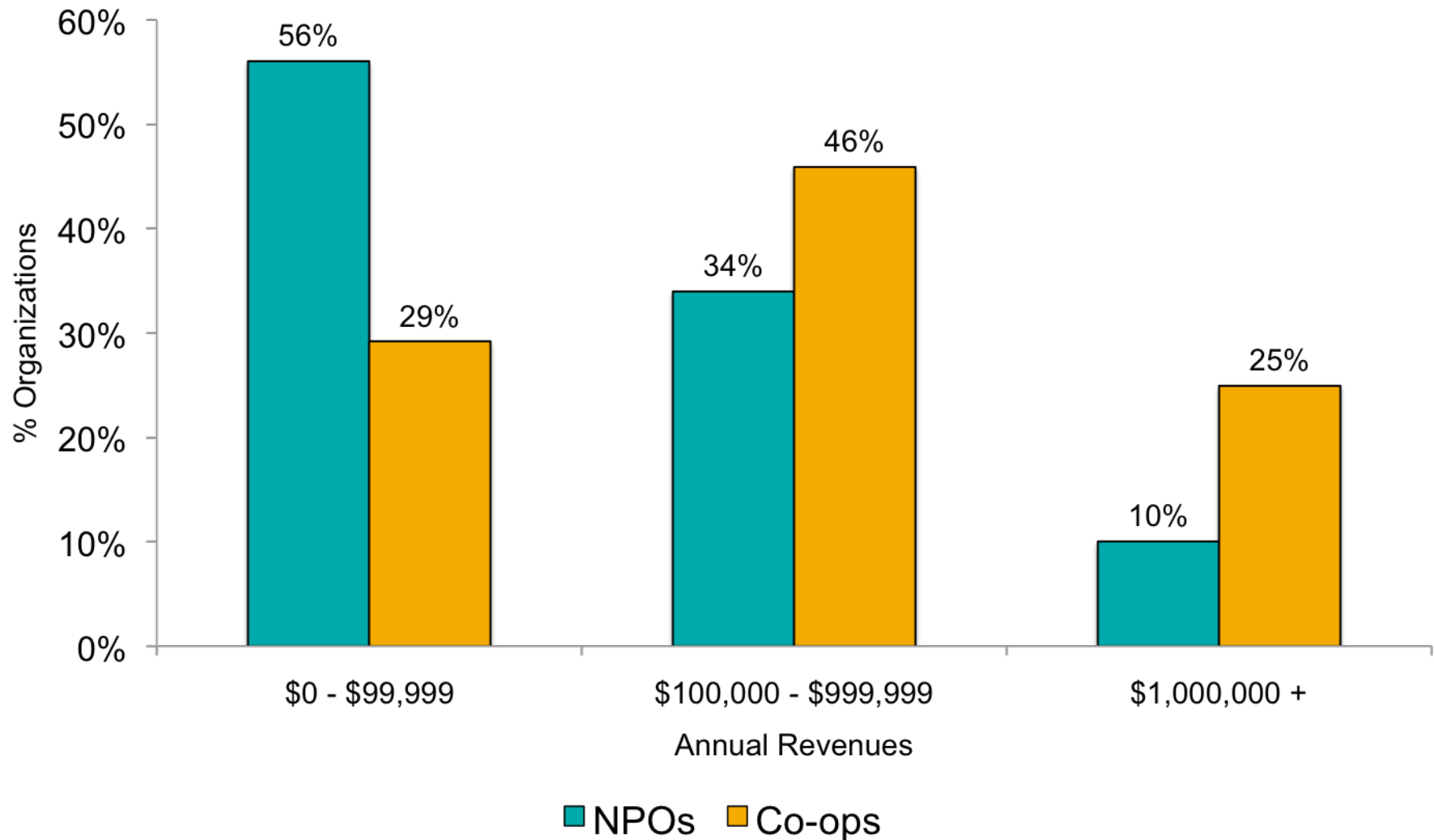
Co-operatives by Primary Activity



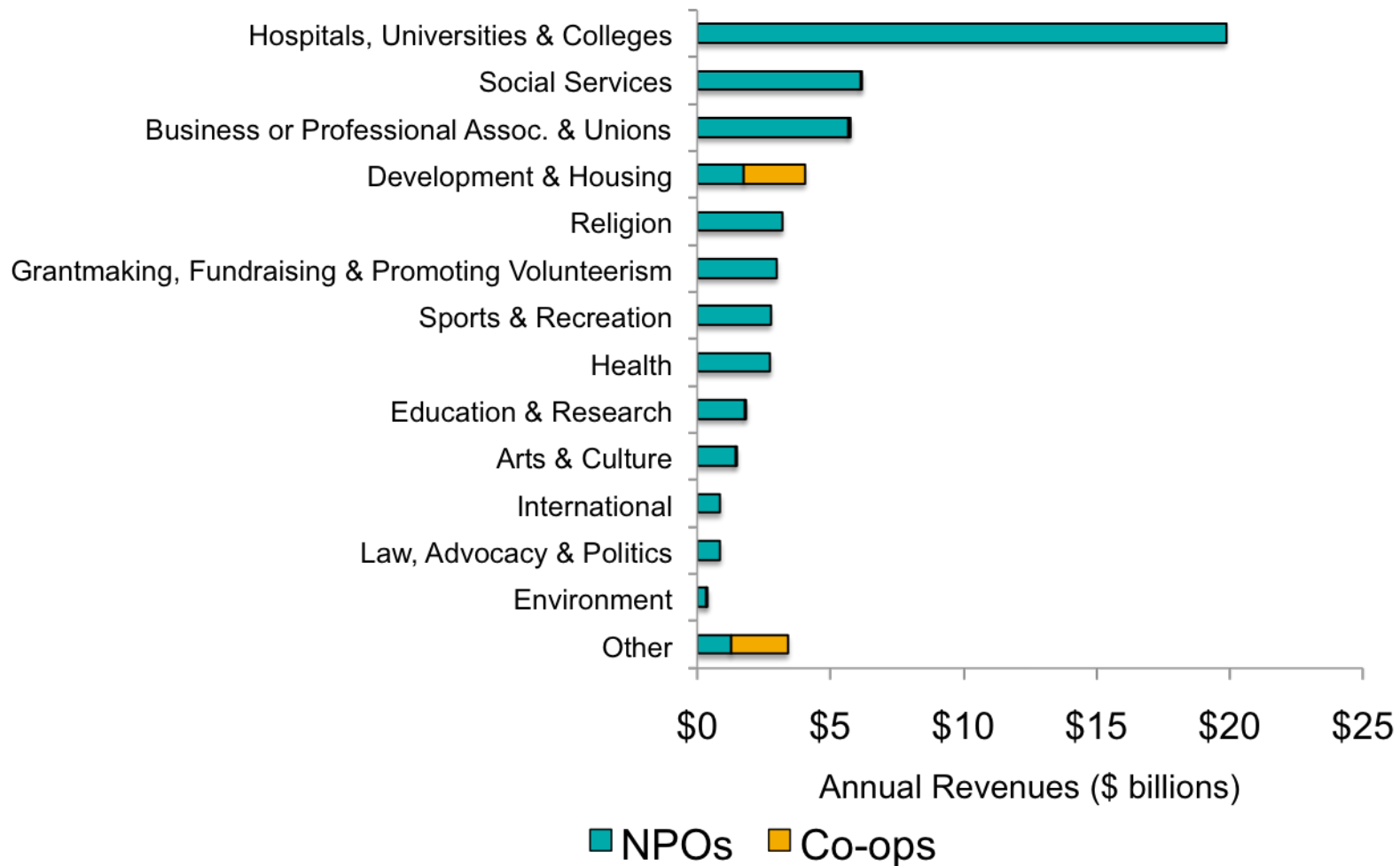
Nonprofits and Co-operatives by Organization Type



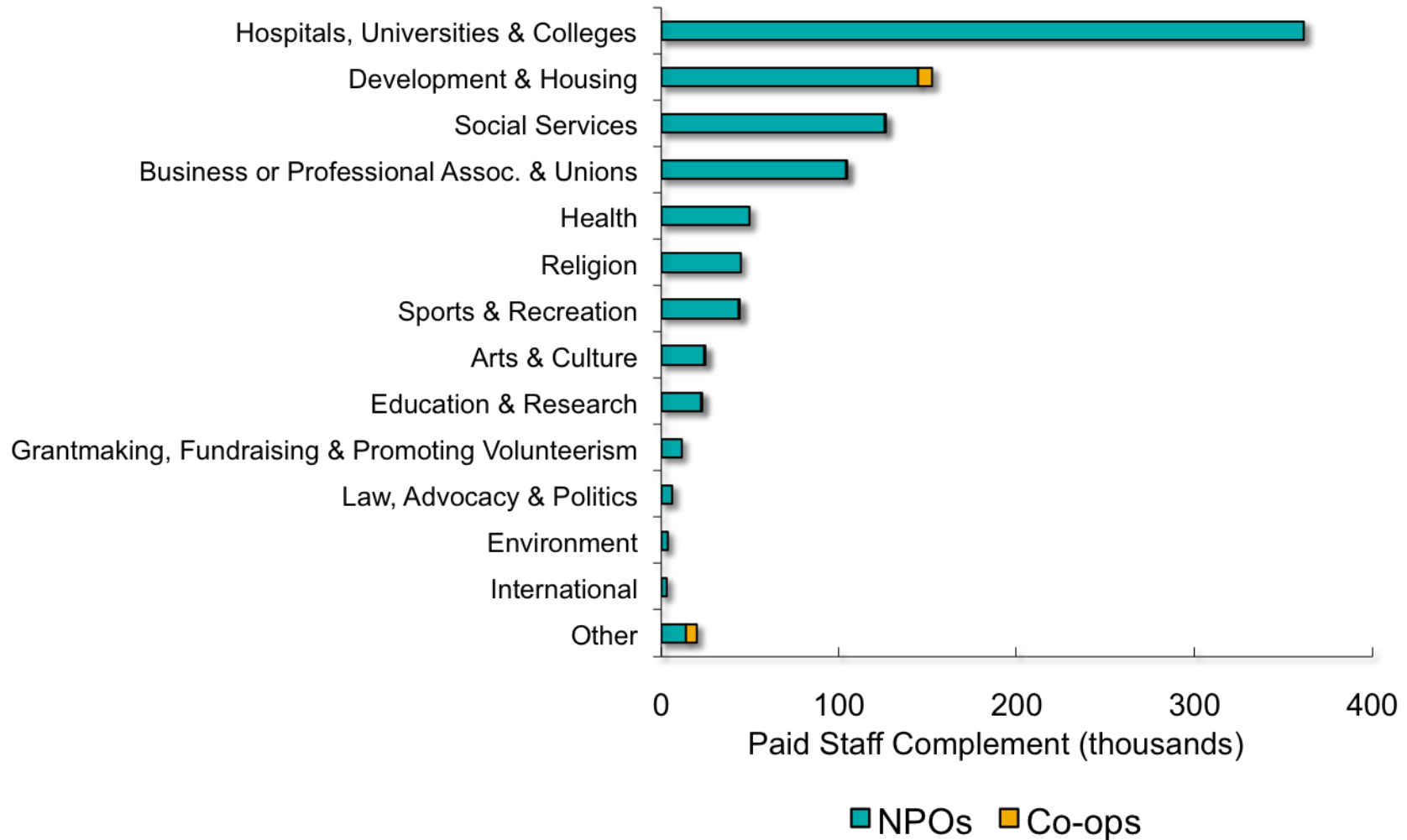
Nonprofits and Co-ops by Annual Revenue Size
