THE EMERGENCE AND RISE OF PLATFORM CO-OPERATIVES: ELEMENTS FOR POTENTIAL TRANSFORMATION OF THE SHARING ECONOMY?

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The focus of the research is on platform co-operatives as alternative models for social-economic organizations online that create and distribute equitable digital work, more secure forms of employment and fairer market transactions within the sharing economy, following the co-operative principles.

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- How can the co-operative model become a viable means for democratizing the sharing economy?
- How can platform co-operativism create better forms of digital work, collectively owned workplaces, and democratically governed firms, where co-operation rather than competition is the guiding value?

RESEARCH GOALS

- To map out self-identified experiences as platform co-operatives in Canada and more broadly, understand their characteristics and processes of socio-economic organization, and document the key factors enabling and constraining their development, growth and sustainability.
- To identify and analyse the organizational strategies, forms of social interaction, education tactics and political actions deployed by platform co-operatives to sustain, promote, and negotiate the co-operative principles and platform values of open Internet, democratic governance and joined ownership within the sharing economy.
